Preferred Qualifications:

- Current Sanitarian-in-Training or Registered Sanitarian and/or a Graduate Degree in Environmental Health, Public Health, or related field

Responsibilities include but not limited to:

- Conducts inspections of food operations, public swimming pools, schools, transient accommodations, smoke free work place programs, and other public or semi-public facilities; Prepares reports which determine compliance with state and local codes and regulations
- Conducts field tests and/or collects various samples as assigned
- Conducts complaint inspections for program operations; Investigates complaints concerning foodborne illness as needed
- Maintains accurate files, data processing and other office records; May assist in preparation of legal or administrative documents
- Works with various state, county, and municipal governments and community groups to promote improved environmental health practices; Conducts educational presentations, including Level 1 Food Safety Training
