- A Bachelor of Public Health, Biological Science, Social Science or another related social services field
- Experience working with culturally and economically diverse populations, including people of color, gay/bisexual/transgender populations, and people living with chronic disease, substance users and persons with mental health diagnosis. Familiarity with public health program implementation and evaluations
- Ability to obtain certification within six months of hire in HIV Counseling, Testing, Referral (CTR) and Hepatitis C
- Current valid Ohio driver's license & access to a motor vehicle

Preferred Qualifications

- Motivational interviewing skills

Responsibilities include but not limited to:

- Providing testing information to potential clients desiring HIV antibody testing
- Conducting HIV/AIDS pre-test and post-test intervention for clients and their sexual partners who may be at increased risk for HIV infections, including providing educational, behavioral, and risk reduction information
- Providing referrals as needed for social services, medical and psychological follow-up
- Address public's requests for HIV/AIDS information through group presentations, TV, radio, and printed materials
- Conduct clerical duties, which include data entry for Electronic Medical Records (EMR) and completing reports
- Develops and continues needs assessment by maintaining relationships with external agencies to identify HIV/AIDS education programs, share resources, and locate services for clientele
- Interacts with staff on HIV/AIDS related programs with emphasis on reducing the spread of HIV in Montgomery County and the surrounding counties (Clark, Darke, Greene, Miami and Preble)
- May be required to play an active role in the event of a public health emergency, which may include changes in responsibilities and working hours.
